Naturally that beer had to be sour, pink, buggy and lightweight. So we brewed a light, tart wheat ale, aged half of the batch for two months in an ex-Wirra Wirra Church Block barrel, added lashings of raspberries and blended this back with 'straight' wheat ale to produce Coalition Man. Unlike its namesake, Coalition Man the beer is refreshing, delicate, complex and considered - and designed to disarm witchhunts fervour...
