

## CASCADE IPA

## IN A NUTSHELL LEAN, AROMATIC AND CASCADEY. GRAPEFRUIT.

Cascade is *the* classic American Craft Hop. The Hop that started a movement and for years pretty much defined the American Pale Ale style. While Cascade these days doesn't have the sexiness of newcomers such as Mosaic, Citra and El Dorado and lacks the high alpha punch of Simcoe, it is one of the most versatile hops around; combining medium intense floral, citrus and grapefruit characters with a clean and balanced bitterness. The perfect 'desert island' hop.

Having plenty of Tassie Cascade on our desert island we saw fit to brew our first single hop IPA - with Whole Leaf Flowers. Given the handling, utilisation, storage and consistency issues that Flowers present, it's little wonder few Breweries commit to brewing exclusively with Whole Leaf. Those who do, such as Sierra Nevada and Victory, claim that their purer form contributes cleaner, bolder and better flavour and aroma than 'processed' pellets.

Besides, wrangling 20kg of Cascade Flowers in Mash, Kettle, Hopback and Fermentor sounded like fun.

Does Tassie Cascade character differ from US Cascade? Do Flowers present differently to Pellets? Time to have a crack at finding out...
