Aaron 'Here-for-the-Hops' Caruana, IPAs and the Wheaty go way back. When we lost him to Google just months before commissioning our brewery, we knew it was only a matter of time before he'd make the trip home to brew with us. Naturally that brew had to be an IPA. In effect Happy Place is a scaled-up version of Aaron's excellent homebrewed West Coast IPA that got us thinking seriously about Brewing 'commercially'.

Big, bitter and hoppy, Happy Place is more of a staple than a stunt beer. Chock full of Citra, Galaxy and Centennial in the Whirlpool and Fermentor, three kilos of Tassie Cascade flowers in the Hopback and totalling over 16 grams per litre, Happy Place has more Hops in it than any other Wheaty Brewing Corps beer to date. Appropriately.

Full of pine, lime and resin characters over a lean and dry body, Happy Place finishes with a bite that belies a bitterness ratio that 'looks more like a Brown Ale'. Bitterness = Happiness. Sitting at the North-Western corner of the Wheaty Bar, drinking a fresh IPA which you helped create, sounds like a Happy Place to me...
